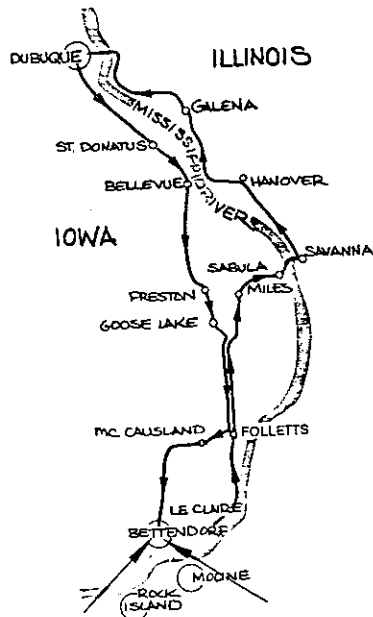

**Saturday, February 20, 1988**



Families on bikes ride riverfront streets, wheels rolling down to the banks of the Mississippi where paddle wheels turn, and the bikers and their bikes board the "Quad City Queen" for ferry service from Iowa to Illinois. The fourth annual RIDE THE RIVER, a 20-mile bike tour of the Mississippi River is set for Sunday, June 19, 1988. The Father's Day event is becoming a Quad Cities tradition.

Registration begins by mail April 3, costing \$5.00 per rider. Fees go to \$7.00 May 3 and are \$10.00 June 3 - 15. Registration fee includes biking hat, course map and a boarding pass for the river crossing. The "QUAD CITY QUEEN" makes ten trips throughout the day, beginning at 6:00 a.m. Crossing times are assigned to each rider on a first come first serve basis. Sign up early to get your first choice! T-shirts are also available for the event.

RIDE THE RIVER begins and ends in Davenport's LeClaire Park, with registration at the Davenport Depot. Pre-registration will be available on Saturday, June 18. Bikers pedal 3 1/2 miles to Leach Park boat landing in Bettendorf and board the "QUAD CITY QUEEN" and land on Moline's Ben Butterworth Parkway. Bikers travel the floodwall in East Moline, the scenic biking trail on the Rock Island Arsenal, the riverfront streets of Rock Island and return to Davenport over the mile-long Centennial Bridge. The course is flat with bike and medical aid stations along the route, as well as entertainment, concession stands, and picnic spots. 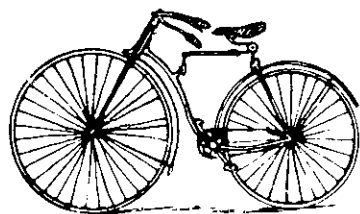

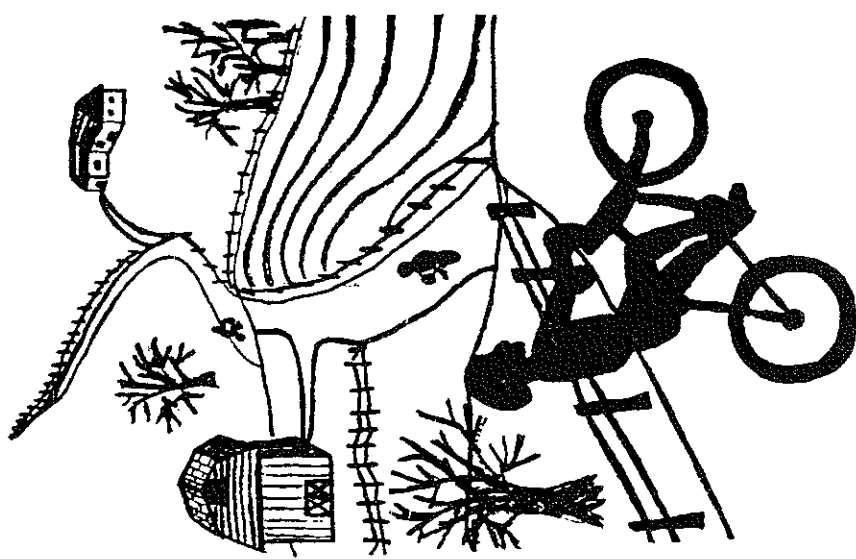
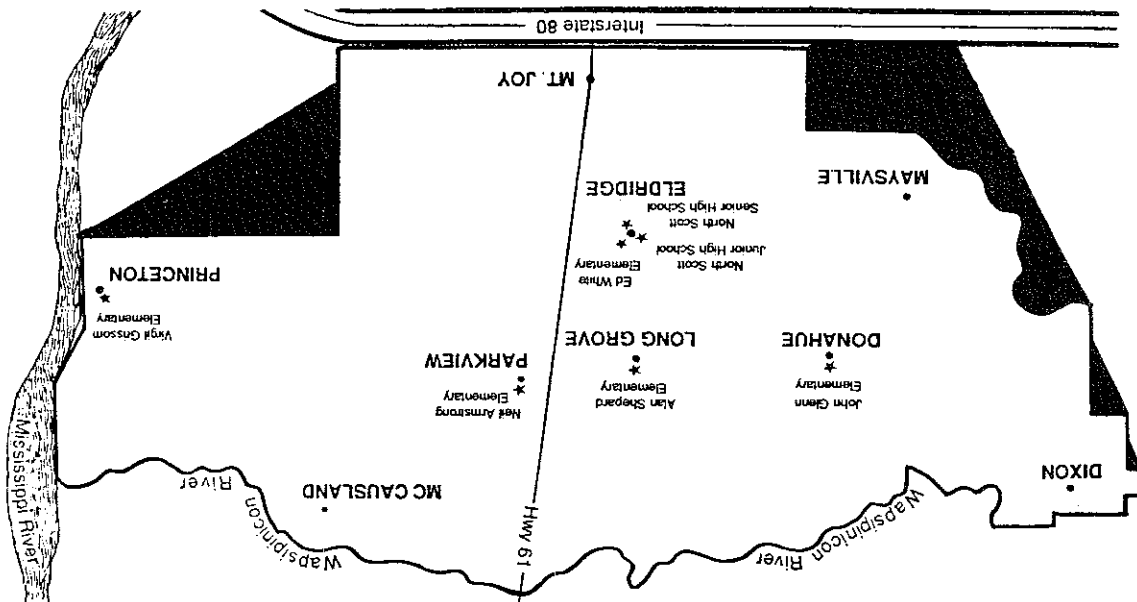
## American Cancer Society's Illinois Bike-A-Thon

# From the Editor

Wow! The brochures are coming in fast and furious. Rides, rides, and more rides. As in the past, I will list them in a timely fashion. At the April Club meeting, I will make a point to bring all that I have coming up so far this year - from all over the world. We receive booklets from many, many touring companies. It is very fun to read through them. They will be available on meeting night for you to browse through.

I have gotten off the track on featuring bike trails; however, I have been receiving some very important information concerning the future of our bike trails that, as bikers, you should be aware of. Below is a plea from the Cedar-Wapsie Group, Sierra Club in Cedar Rapids.

## Action Alert

**YOU DON'T WANT TO LOSE THE CEDAR VALLEY NATURE TRAIL**, Iowa's unique treasure, a 52-mile conservation-recreation corridor linking Cedar Rapids and Waterloo!

**IT COULD HAPPEN!** One Benton Co. landowner has refused to bargain with trail officials seeking a reasonable and fair arrangement to maintain the continuity of the trail and satisfy the needs of the adjacent owner.

Clearly this landowner holds a valid title to a parcel of land near the mid-point of the trail, following a decision of the Iowa Supreme Court. Other landowners have agreed to sell or lease sections of right-of-way to permit continued use.

The stalemate between the landholder and the trail authorities has resulted in the need for Iowa State intervention. While any landowner has the legal right to resist selling his land for the benefit of a public project, the right of the public also weighs heavily where its interest is paramount.

Last year an estimated 10,000 to 20,000

Iowans and out-of-staters found the trail's preservation an Iowa PLUS. We have developed a wonderfully attractive state resource that must remain available to our citizens. Most of its charm lies in its unbroken length, an exciting challenge to both hikers and bikers. Business people in the eight trailside villages have testified to the economic advantage of a popular trail. The corridor offers a rare and badly needed shelter for small wildlife species. It is also a valuable windbreak against soil erosion. The unity of the trail is also imperative if there is ever to be a return of the corridor to a transportation route.


Your Iowa State Senator and Representative need to hear from you today. Call 515-281-5129 or write at once to Iowa General Assembly, State Capitol, Des Moines, Iowa, 50319. Tell them your concern that the trail may soon be bulldozed or fenced off. Ask that the Cedar Valley Nature Trail's preservation be a top priority. Ask them to support vigorously legislative action which will ensure the acquisition of the threatened trail segment in Benton Co.
